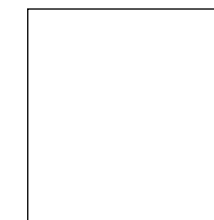

BIOGRAPHIES



Ayaan Hirsi Ali

Born in Somalia, Ayaan Hirsi Ali is a former member of the Dutch parliament and author of the best seller *Infidel* (2007). Her much publicized efforts to expose the plight of Muslim women in Europe resulted in great public debate - a controversy which eventually framed her decision to depart the Netherlands. She is currently a fellow at the American Enterprise Institute in Washington, DC.



Henryk Broder

Henryk Broder is a German journalist and author who focuses on Jewish topics, National Socialism and the German left. He has written for *Der Spiegel* and the Berlin newspaper *Der Tagesspiegel*. He is the author of the German best seller *Hurray - We Surrender!*



Claire Berlinski

Claire Berlinski is an academic, journalist and novelist. Receiving her Ph.D. from Oxford University in England, she has lived and worked in Britain, Thailand, Laos and now resides in both Turkey and Paris. She is the author of *Menace in Europe* (2006).



Greg Davis

Gregory M. Davis, Ph.D., is the author of *Religion of Peace?* (World Ahead 2006) and, with Bryan Daly, producer and director of the feature documentary *Islam: What the West Needs to Know* (Quixotic Media 2006).



Leon de Winter

Leon de Winter has become one of the most successful of contemporary Dutch writers, film writers and producers. His works have focused on contemporary European identity and he has become an outspoken critic of what he believes to be Europe's appeasement of Muslim militancy.



Arnaud Dotézac

Arnaud Dotézac is a professor of law in Lausanne, Switzerland. He has a background in the law of religions, especially Islamic law, and the law of armed conflict. He is a founding member of the Swiss Center for Military History and Prospective. His work focuses on the means for addressing Muslim disaffection with European democratic values.



Afshin Ellian

Afshin Ellian is a Dutch/Iranian poet and professor at the Faculty of Law of Leiden University in Holland. An Iranian dissident, he is a renowned columnist for the leading Dutch daily *NRC Handelsblad*, a published poet and philosophic author. Ellian's literary criticism and advocacy of human rights and democracy are considered to be a part of both the European and Middle Eastern debates.



Richard D. Heideman

Highly respected international trial lawyer Richard Heideman is the senior partner of Heideman, Nudelman and Kalik P.C., a Washington, DC law firm that serves as lead counsel in pending litigation on behalf of victims of terror in the United States and abroad.



Hugh Hewitt

Hugh Hewitt is the host of a daily nationally syndicated talk radio show heard in more than 100 cities across the country. He is a Professor of Law at Chapman University Law School, the Executive Editor of *Townhall.com*, and one of the country's most widely read bloggers at www.HughHewitt.com



Philippe Karsenty

Philippe Karsenty is a French journalist and media critic. After a brief foray into French politics in 2002, he founded Media Ratings, the first ever French media rating agency. Media-Ratings has paid particular attention to the failure of the French media to document the rise of militant Islam in France.



Robert Kaufman

Robert Kaufman, Ph.D., is professor of Public Policy at the Pepperdine University School of Public Policy. He is the author of *Henry M. Jackson: A Life in Politics* (2004) and earned his Ph.D. in International Relations from Columbia University as well as a J. D. from Georgetown University.



Sally McNamara

Sally McNamara is a Senior Policy Analyst in European Affairs at The Heritage Foundation's Margaret Thatcher Center for Freedom. She specializes in U.S.-European relations, with particular focus on economic reform policy, trade issues and the War on Terrorism. Ms. McNamara previously worked as Chief Parliamentary Aide to Roger Helmer in the European Parliament in Brussels.



Daniel Pipes

Daniel Pipes, Ph.D., is an academic and journalist and Director of the Middle East Forum whose writings on Islam, Europe and the threat to the West have appeared in newspapers and magazines around the world. His website, www.danielpipes.org, is the single most accessed internet source of specialized information on the Middle East and Islam.



Dennis Prager

Dennis Prager is one of America's most respected radio talk show hosts. His popular daily show is syndicated nationally and airs live, Monday through Friday, from his home station, KRLA, in Los Angeles. Widely sought by television for his opinions, he has appeared on Larry King Live, Hardball, Hannity & Colmes, CBS Evening News, The Today Show and many other programs.



Tashbih Sayyed

Indian born Tashbih Sayyed, Ph.D., is a journalist, editor of Muslim World Today and the President of the Council for Democracy and Tolerance - an organization devoted to bringing about a change in any radical, extremist or fundamentalist thinking of Muslims in the United States.



Bret Stephens

Bret Stephens is the former editor-in-chief of the Jerusalem Post - a position he held from 2002 to 2004 and a former editorial writer for the Wall Street Journal Europe. He is currently a writer, editorialist and member of the Wall Street Journal Editorial Board. He is the regular columnist of "Global View", which appears in the Wall Street Journal every Tuesday.



Mark Steyn

Mark Steyn is the author of *America Alone: The End Of The World As We Know It*, a New York Times bestseller and Number One in Canada. He is a columnist for National Review and The Chicago Sun-Times and his writing on politics, war, arts and culture is syndicated around the world.



Ibn Warraq

Ibn Warraq is a best-selling author and scholar, born in Pakistan, and educated in Great Britain. His name is a pseudonym adopted by a long chain of Muslim dissidents throughout Islamic history. He is the author of *Why I Am Not a Muslim*, and the forthcoming book *Defending the West: A Critique of Edward Said's Orientalism* (Prometheus Books, August 2007.)



James Q. Wilson

James Q. Wilson is the Ronald Reagan Professor of Public Policy at Pepperdine University in California, and a professor emeritus at UCLA. From 1961 to 1987 he was a professor of government at Harvard University. He was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom by President George W. Bush in 2003.
